Controlled a large network of spies and reported reformist activities extensively to the Home Secretary, Lord Sidmouth. Witness in the Redford v Birley case.	
<b>Fielden</b>	<b>Mr</b>	Withington Lodge	Withington	Magistrate	One of the group assembled in Mr. Buxton's house in Mount Street.
<b>Fletcher</b>	<b>Ralph</b>			Magistrate	One of the group assembled in Mr. Buxton's house in Mount Street.
<b>Hay</b>	<b>William Robert</b>	Ackworth	Yorkshire	Clergyman	Ex-barrister. Rector of Yorkshire town of Ackworth. Magistrate. Chairman of Salford Quarter Sessions. Prolific in his correspondence with the Home Office. Witness in the Redford v Birley case.
<b>Hulton</b>	<b>William</b>	Hulton Park	Bolton	Landed gent	Chairman of the Magistrates. High Sheriff of Lancashire. Little previous involvement in local judicial affairs. Witness at Hunt's trial and also in the Redford v Birley case. Issued the warrant for Hunt's arrest.
<b>Jackson</b>	<b>Thomas</b>	17 George street	Manchester	Magistrate	Reported to the Home Office the events of the day and also the previous day at White Moss
<b>Mallory</b>	<b>Rev Mr</b>			Magistrate	One of the group assembled in Mr. Buxton's house in Mount Street.
<b>Marriott</b>	<b>Mr</b>		Prestwich	Magistrate	One of the group assembled in Mr. Buxton's house in Mount Street.
<b>Norris</b>	<b>James</b>	St James's Square	Manchester	Barrister	Stipendiary Magistrate of Manchester. Steward of the Manor of Manchester. Along with Hulton, Hay and Ethelston, one of the leading group of magistrates involved with Peterloo.
<b>Silvester</b>	<b>J</b>			Magistrate	One of the group assembled in Mr. Buxton's house in Mount Street.
<b>Tatton</b>	<b>Mr.</b>			Magistrate	One of the group assembled in Mr. Buxton's house in Mount Street.
<b>Trafford</b>	<b>Trafford</b>	Oughtrington Hall	Cheshire	Magistrate	Accompanied L'Estrange on the ground at the meeting.
<b>Wheeler</b>	<b>Mr</b>			Magistrate	Told by Town Constable Jonathan Andrew that the serving of Hunt's warrant would need military assistance.
<b>Wright</b>	<b>Mr</b>		Flixton	Magistrate	One of the group assembled in Mr. Buxton's house in Mount Street. Later read the Riot Act at New Cross.
