Ransome Mr. J A	5 Mosley Street	Manchester	Surgeon	Quaker. Advised Hay on extent of injuries caused by cavalry - slight! Refused badly injured James Lees of Delph a bed in the Infirmery because he disapproved of his political zeal.

Simmons William	26 George Street 21 Oldham Street	Manchester	Surgeon	Witness. John Lees inquest. HO40 16. Attended John Hulme (presumably at Infirmery)
Thorpe Robert		Manchester	Surgeon	One of the Yeomen Cavalry. An Infirmery surgeon. Member of the Manchester Pitt Club.
Wilde James		Eccles	Surgeon	A Yeoman Cavalry rider.
Wilson William J	Spring Gardens	Manchester	Surgeon	Special constable? Stoned while dispersing the crowd in Peter Street.
Wood Robert	New Cross	Manchester	Chemist / druggist	Witness. Trial of Henry Hunt and the Redford v Birley case.
